### Introduction

  1. David had more than one wife 1 Samuel 27:3; 2 Samuel 5:13; Matthew 19:8-9
  2. David offered sacrifices 2 Samuel 24:24; Psalm 51:19, 17
  3. David did made instruments of music 1 Samuel 16:14-23; 2 Chronicles 7:6 (only the Levites were to play); 29:25-27 (Hezekiah 300 years after David, but the worship is being reestablished); Nehemiah 12:27, 36; Ezra 3:9-10 (500 years after David, the coming back to Jerusalem and reestablishing worship again)
  4. Amos 6:5
2. Are we obligated to do the same thing David did? Can we pick what David did and leave the other stuff alone?
  1. If we want to keep one part of the law we must keep it all Galatians 5:3-4
  2. In the reading of the Law there is a veil over our faces 2 Corinthians 3:6-16
  3. Hebrews 3:1; 7:11, 12, 17; 8:8-12
  4. Colossians 2:14; Ephesians 2:15
3. What about music in our worship to God?
  1. John 4:23-24 attitude and truth John 17:17
  2. Never in the New Testament is there worship with an mechanical instrument of music.
  3. Matthew 26:30 (Mark 14:26); Acts 2:47; 4:24; 16:25; Romans 15:9; 1 Corinthians 14:15; Ephesians 5:19 (the instrument to be played is the heart); Colossians 3:16; Hebrews 2:12; 13:15; Revelation 15:3-4
  4. Is it a command that we worship God with an mechanical instrument of music? If so does everyone have to play one of these instruments? Can I worship God without one?

### III Conclusion

1. David did many things that we cannot do today in our worship to God!
2. We are not obligated to do anything David did because there is a change in the law
3. We are to worship God in spirit and in truth and we do not need a mechanical instrument to do
4. Will you do what you want or what God desires?
