 2. We must listen to the right source John 10:10; 12:48; 14:6
 3. We need to listen to the truth John 1:17; 17:17; Proverbs 28:9
2. Letting those not qualified serve as leaders verses 9, 11, 13
 1. There is no need to set aside God's way John 6:68; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; John 20:30-31
 2. They offered the government to the wrong people 1 Timothy 3:6
 3. They made excuses for not doing verse 9, 11, 13
 4. Excuses by Moses was not accepted Exodus 3
 5. Excuses offered Luke 14:18
 6. None of those who offered excuses received the blessings of the Lord!
 7. They did not want to go forward. They wanted to keep on doing what they had been doing, No change Matthew 25:24-30
3. We can trust in the wrong thing, they started trusting in the bramble
 1. Men offer the wrong things John 10:10; 1 Corinthians 1:12-13; Romans 16:17-18
 2. We need to trust in the Lord, truth Proverbs 3:5
 3. Only truth can give us heaven John 17:17; 14:6; Matthew 7:13-14
