II Discussion

1. There is a way that is right and cannot be wrong!
 1. This is doing only what God said to do
 2. We can know what God wants done by three ways
 1. Example Acts 20:7; Hebrews 10:25; 1 Corinthians 11:17; When did they come together?
 2. Implication
 1. Where does it say Peter repented?
 2. Where does it say that the Corinthians repented Acts 18:8
 3. By direct statement 1 Corinthians 16:1-2
2. What God has not specified is allowed.
 1. This statement allows the gates of anything to be opened
 2. Steak and potatoes for the Lord's Supper
 3. Lighting of candles for worship'
 4. Counting beads for worship
 5. Why not have cake walks, pie sales, and yard sales to raise money for the church? 1 Corinthians 16:1-2
3. Examples
 1. Was it wrong for Joseph to be sold by his brethren? Where?
 2. Was it wrong for Nadab and Abihu to offer strange fire to the Lord? Where? Leviticus 10:1-2; Exodus 30:1-10
 3. Was Moses wrong for striking the rock in Numbers 20:7-13? Why? Exodus 17:5-6 Moses was tole to strike the rock
 4. Why was King Saul condemned in 1 Samuel 15?
 1. He was told to utterly destroy the Amalekites
 2. God did not say, thou shalt save some.
 5. Why was Uzziah killed by God 2 Samuel 6:6-7; Numbers 7:9

2. We can do only those things that are allowed by God. To change what God said is rebellion and stubbornness
