Introduction

- 1. 1 Samuel 4:1-9
- 2. There are several arks mentioned in the Bible, Noah, Moses the ark of the covenant
- 3. The description of this ark is as follows:
 - 1. 2 1/2 cubits in length 45 inches
 - 2. 1 1/2 cubits in width 27 inches
 - 3. 1 1/2 cubits in heigh 27 inches
 - 4. Made of wood and overlaid with gold
 - 5. Four rings of gold with two on each side so that the priest could carry it with the poles that went into the rings
 - 6. The Mercy Seat was on top made of one piece of gold, signified the presence of God
 - 7. There were also two cherubim of gold, facing toward the Mercy Seat
- 4. The ark played a significant roll in the history of Israel Joshua 3:13; 6:4
- 5. The ark became God in a box to the Israelites
- 6. This ark became mystical, magical, and miraculous which is an incorrect view of this box
- 7. God's presence will help, but we must have our lives right to have the blessings of God.
- 8. We too can make things religious an idol, a God in a box if we let them Matthew 15:9 II Discussion
- 1. The Bible can become mystical to some
 - 1. The Bible is the Word of God John 12:48; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 3:15-16
 - 2. Some think that by reading certain passages that something magical will happen
- 2. Some think the Lord's Supper is miraculous
 - 1. The Lord's Supper is important 1 Corinthians 11:23-27
 - 2. But it is no more important than any other command of God
 - 3. Some do abuse the Lord's Supper today
- 3. Some think that prayer of the preacher is magical
 - 1. The Bible says that the prayer of a righteous man is important James 5:16; 1 Peter 3:12
 - 2. Let us all strive to be the righteous person so our prayers will be heard.
- 4. Some think that baptism in miraculous
 - 1. Some think that it will wash away unrepented sins
 - 2. It is about conversion to Christ Acts 3:16; 26:27-29
- 5. Some think there is something mystical in giving
 - 1. We are to give but some think they can buy their way into heaven
 - 2. 1 Corinthians 16:1-2; 2 Corinthians 9:6-7

III Conclusion

- 2. We too can have a form of godliness without power 2 Timothy 3:5
- 3. Since God can see us all the time it would behave us to act accordingly
