- 2. The tenor of the book of Hebrews is to keep the Jewish Christians from slipping from the truth and going back into Judism
- 3. Because of this the book of Hebrews is written to show the superiority of Christ over Moses; the law of Christ over the law of Moses; and over any human organization
- 4. We can slip from the great salvation
- 5. Today we want to define the word "slip" discuss the symptoms of slipping, what causes drifting, and the consequences of slipping

- 1. The meaning of the word "slip"
 - 1. Slip means to flow by or past; to glide by. As a boat with no anchor
 - 2. To drift is to mealiest one's salvation Hebrews 2:3; Matthew 22:5
 - 3. To neglect the garden long enough the weeds will take over, so it is in the spiritual real, the weeds of worldliness will take over.
 - 4. To slip away is to forsake the Lord John 6:66
 - 5. To slip away is to depart from God Isaiah 59:1-2
- 2. The symptoms of slipping
 - 1. We can see it and need to stop it before it is too late, shock!
 - 2. You can treat the symptoms and never effect the disease
 - 3. Lose the Joy of Salvation Philippians 4:4 Psalm 51:10, 12
 - 4. Ceasing to pray 1 Thessalonians 5:17
 - 5. Discontent; critical Matthew 7:1-3
 - 6. Excuses Luke 14:16-24: Matthew 22:5
 - 7. Neglect Bible study 1 Peter 2:2; Psalm 119:105, 130; Hebrews 10:23-25
 - 8. Neglect the assembly Hebrews 10:25
 - 9. Less work in the church 1 Corinthians 15:58; Philippians 2:12
 - 10. Neglect the soul Proverbs 11:30
- 3. The causes of slipping
 - 1. Failure to appreciate God's love John 3:16
 - 2. Failure to appreciate Christ
 - 3. Failure to appropriate the power of Christ
 - 4. Failure to appropriate the hope of Christ Hebrews 6:19
- 4. The consequences of slipping
 - 1. Deceitfulness is involved. Most don't start out to leave God. Like a boat not anchored it will be away from where we want it quickly, silently,
 - 2. Downward not upward. Dead fish go down stream live fish go up stream
 - 3. Damnation of the soul
 - 1. We are responsible for our drifting not God 2 Corinthians 5:10
 - 2. God has given us all we need to keep from drifting.
