 - 1. Some want to go to a priest to be absolved of guilt 1 Timothy 2:5-6
 - 2. Some want to go to the old Law for terms of salvation Colossians 2:14; Romans 7:1-6; Hebrews 5:8-9
 - 3. Some want to go to the thief on the cross Hebrews 9:15-17
 - 4. But we must go to Christ John 14:6; Acts 4:12; John 12:48
- 2. He wanted to buy the blessings of God
 - 1. Some want to buy instead of consecrating themselves Acts 8:18
 - 2. Some want to base salvation on moral goodness Acts 10
 - 3. This blessing of salvation is not bought with anything from us Titus 3:5; Romans 6:23; Ephesians 2:8-9
 - 4. Our salvation has already been bought 1 Corinthians 6:19-20; 1 Peter 1:18-19
- 3. He was prejudice 2 Kings 5:11
 - 1. Some have a fixed opinion of what they want God's way to be Jeremiah 10:23; Proverbs 14:12
 - 2. Some want a show or something mysterious Matthew 15:9; 1 Corinthians 1:18-25
 - 3. Some make light of God's way Genesis 19:14; Matthew 22:5
 - 4. We must submit to God's wishes if we want salvation from sin 1 Peter 5:5-6; Matthew 18:1-4
- 4. He wanted to substitute for God's plan
 - 1. Some want faith only James 2:24
 - 2. Some want an altar of prayer Acts 22:16
 - 3. Some want sprinkling or pouring Romans 6:2; Colossians 2:12
 - 4. Some want denominationalism Matthew 16:18; Romans 16:16; Ephesians 4:1-6
 - 5. Some want human names Acts 11:26; 1 Peter 4:16

III Conclusion

- 1. One of Satan's objectives is to turn men toward the things which they want for salvation and not the things that God requires
- 2. Naaman wanted to be treated like a great man who was a leper. Elisha treated him like a leper. Jesus did not come to call executives and socialites, but sinners to repentance.
