- 1. Numbers 14:24
- 2. Caleb had the spirit the spirit of obedience, he had a choice before him, he choose to serve God
- 3. We have the same choice before us today Joshua 24:15
- 4. We respond to the commands of God every time we hear a command of God either in a positive or negative way Matthew 27:37; Rom 5:8; John 3:16; Psalm 147:1
- 5. How do we react when we hear commands of God?
- 6. We are to be like Caleb of old who responded in a positive way immediately to the promises of God

- 1. The spirit of obedience requires us to do God's will promptly Numbers 13-14
  - 1. Who are these men, Shaphat, Igal, Oshea, Palti, Gaddiel, Gaddi, Ammiel, Sethur, Nahbe, Geuel, Shammua?
  - 2. These are the ten spies who spied out the land and gave an evil report
  - 3. Caleb says let us go at once Numbers 13:30
  - 4. The other said no!
  - 5. Saul obeyed immediately Acts 9:17-18
  - 6. The jailer obeyed immediately Acts 16:33
- 2. When others will not obey we must obey Numbers 14:6-10; 40-45
  - 1. We cannot go along with the crowd Exodus 23:2
  - 2. If we did do what the crowd did it would be a religion based on others Matthew 10:37
  - 3. Joshua and Caleb pleaded with the people to do what was right and they were stonded
  - 4. What is our response when we are told that we are sin sick and wrong? Everybody else is doing it!
- 3. The spirit of obedience requires us to disregard comfort, convenience and personal preferences.
  - 1. Canaan was a land that flowed with mild and honey, but it had its problems Numbers 13:27-28, 33
  - 2. Their eyes were on their problems not on the blessings Ephesian 1:3; Matthew 6:33; John 14:-13
  - 3. Jesus told 12 men to go into all the world and they did it. Colossians 1:23
  - 4. What would we say to the Lord?
  - 5. They wanted rewards without sacrifice Matthew 16:24-26 Romans 12:1-2
- 4. The spirit of obedience does not permit us to reject the commands that we do not understand
  - 1. It did not seem reasonable for them to go into this land that was inhabited by giants Numbers 13:33
  - 2. God has always given commands that to men seem to be foolish
    - 1. Joshua 6 walking around a city to capture it
    - 2. 2 Kings 5 dipping in the Jordan river to be cleansed of a disease
    - 3. 1 Corinthians 1:18, 21, 25 the foolishness of preaching
- 5. The spirit of obedience demands more than the minimum
- 1. To go the second mile Matthew 5:41
  - 2. Do we do enough to just get by?
- 3. Do we say to the Lord how little do i have to do to be saved?
- 6. The spirit of obedience requires us to overcome obstacles or excuses.
  - 1. Caleb said we shall over come Numbers 13:30
    - 2. All excuses will be taken away Luke 9:57-62; 14:16-24
