1. John 8:12

## II Discussion

1. One purpose for light is to illuminate an area in which to move about
  - a. God begins creation with light so as to work Genesis 1:3
  - b. The pillar of fire during the night was for light and protection Exodus 13:21; 14:20
  - c. Jesus is the Light of the world, John 8:12; 9:4
    - i. He is the Sun that chases ignorance, the clouds of doubt and the darkness of despair away, and who fills the soul with the light of heavenly knowledge and hope. B.W. Johnson commentary on John p. 137
    - ii. He gives light to us Luke 1:77 – 79; John 14:6
    - iii. Illuminate the path to God (Psalm 119:105; 2 Timothy 1:8-10
2. Another purpose for light is to disclose and illuminate dangerous obstacles
  - a. Regardless of how well we know our homes, we still, when getting up turn the lights on
    - i. We know that toys, tools, chairs or other furniture may be in the way.
    - ii. Outside we still turn the lights on, to see what may be in the way, snake or stick
  - b. We need the light of God's Word to find and stay on the "narrow" and "strait" gate and path Matthew 7:13-14
  - c. Jesus tells us some obstacles that might get in our way to "the way."
    - i. False prophets Matthew 7:15; 1 John 4:1
    - ii. Men Matthew 10:17
    - iii. Leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees Matthew 16:6, 12
    - iv. Covetousness Luke 12:15
  - d. Unless we are walking in the Light of God's Dear Son, then we can stumble and fall; every obstacle comes as a surprise of which we are not prepared to cope Jeremiah 10:23
3. Another purpose of light is to enhance the beauty of our surroundings
  - a. Without light there would be no enjoyment of colors
    - i. When the sun goes down on flowers watch how the colors seem to fade away also

- ii. A muddy pond in which there is not much light, will have fish with no vivid colors!
  - b. The light that Jesus sheds upon our upward journey makes life more pleasant and beautiful John 10:10
  - c. Not only do we have physical blessing but the spiritual blessings as well Ephesians 1:3; 2 Peter 1:3; Luke 18:29-30
- 4. Three things implied in this "I am."
  - 1. That there is darkness in the world apart from Jesus John 1:4-5; 1 John 1:7; John 8:12
  - 2. That Christ is the only light John 14:6; Jeremiah 10:23
  - 3. That the Light of Christ is for the benefit of all mankind "world" 1 Timothy 2:4; Matthew 11:28-30; Revelation 22:17
