## Introduction

- 1. 1 Corinthians 10:1-13
- 2. "Moreover" is a transition word and it connects the above thoughts with what Paul is saying in this section.
- 3. The call in these section is for Christians to be disciplined or in self control
- 4. Paul is reminding them of how God dealt with His chosen people in the past.
  - a. Because they might have been of God's blessed does not mean that they would have automatic success.
  - b. They were His blessed people but they were disciplined, disqualified and were dead!
  - c. Thus this is the reason for self-discipline
- 5. If we do not learn from history we are destined to repeat it; Paul does not want them to repeat history but learn from the mistakes of others.
- 6. Let us learn that God does take care of His people, and that does not mean that they are not disciplined.

II Discussion

- 1. God's providential care for His people
  - a. The cloud by day and pillar by night Exodus 13:20-22; 33:9; 1 Kings 8:10
  - b. The cloud and pillar guided and protected God's People
  - c. God is with His people Matthew 28:20; Hebrews 13:5-6
  - d. We have His Word to guide us Psalm 119:105, 130; Matthew 4:4
- 2. Baptism of Moses
  - a. Out of bondage into freedom
  - b. The Corinthians were baptized Acts 18:8; 1 Corinthians 12:13
  - c. We have crossed over from bondage to freedom Romans 6:3-18,20,22
- 3. The diet
  - a. They were given manna to eat Exodus 16:14-15
  - b. This is called angels' food Psalm 78:25
  - c. Jesus is the Bread of Life which came down from heaven John 6:32-35
- 4. The drink
  - a. God provided them with water Exodus 15:22; 17:17; Numbers 20:1-3
  - b. The Rock was Christ showing the preexistence or pre-incarnate Christ
  - c. The verb "drink" is in the imperfect tense and shows their continual access to the supernatural source of supply.
  - d. There was a rabbin legend that the water actually followed the Israelites for 40 years, in one form a fragment of rock 15 feet high that followed the people and gushed out water
- 5. God was displeased with them
  - a. The AVS has "Howbeit with most of them God was not well pleased."
  - b. Many or most only 2 were saved
  - c. They were "overthrown" this word is used to illustrate the destruction of a hurricane. A powerful picture of the desolation
- 6. These were for our examples
  - a. This is the word for type.
  - b. Many events in the Old Testament were types Hebrews 10:1-4
  - c. Illustrations are used to show what to be done and what not to be done; both are used in these verse

- 1. Let us learn and know and feel confident that God will take care of us, if we will follow Him.
- 2. We must discipline ourselves from being disqualified from following
- 3. Are you following the Lord?
- 4. Why not? There are blessing to be had when one does
