 - a. The text says, "thou" which is God
 - b. He has given us His one John 3:13; Galatians 4:4
- 3. To whom was the banner given?
 - a. The text says to those who fear Him
 - b. Ecclesiastes 12:13
 - c. Not just anybody (the drunkard, adultery or worldly minded person, denominations
- 4. There are many ways to unfurl this banner
 - a. By word of mouth Psalm 107:2
 - b. By manner of life Ephesians 4:1; 2 Corinthians 6:17
- 5. For what purpose was this banner given
 - a. The text says that it may be displayed because of truth John 17:17
 - b. To use the banner it must be taken out of its case 2 Timothy 2:15
 - c. We must use this banner if we want salvation from our sins John 8:32; Acts 2:38; Luke 24:46-47
 - d. If we want others to have salvation we must tell them Matthew 28:19-20; 2 Timothy 2:2

 - a. We will let others know the balm for their ills Jeremiah 8:22
 - b. It will let the devil know on what side we are on James 4:7
 - c. It will help the faint hearted overcome Isaiah 40:29-31
