 - b. They did not always accept the herald or the good news. Acts 13:46
 - 2. He was to preach to the poor
 - a. Matthew 5:3
 - b. Is this poor in money, at what point would one be rated poor?
 - c. Poor is spirit is an attitude;
 - i. Depending on God. Philippians 4:13; John 15:5; Luke 5:8
 - ii. Denying self. Matthew 16:24; Titus 2:12
 - 3. Heal the brokenhearted
 - a. To console those who are deeply afflicted, or whose hearts are broken by their sense of their sinfulness. Matthew 5:4
 - b. Under the Old law there was conscience of sin Hebrews 10:2
 - c. Under the New law our sins are covered Romans 4:7
 - d. We are healed by His strips 1 Peter 2:24
 - 4. Preach deliverance to the captives
 - a. Captives means a prisoner of war
 - b. We have pardon through Jesus John 8:32, 36; Romans 6:18; Galatians 5:1
 - 5. The blind will recover their sight
 - a. John's disciples were to tell him what Jesus was doing. Matthew 11:5
 - b. But this is spiritual blindness. Matthew 23:16, 17, 19, 24, 26; 15:13
 - c. There is a way to see! Revelation 3:17-18
 - d. Come and see. John 1:39, 46 but we must have our eyes open so that we can see!
 - 6. Set at liberty them that are bruised
 - a. Liberty is freedom or remission Hebrews 10:18; 9:22
 - b. We can have remission or freedom Ephesians 1:7; Colossians 1:14
 - c. We have it by being baptized Acts 2:38
 - 7. To preach the acceptable year of the Lord
 - a. The year of jubilee when all were set free from slavery and debt and restoration was made of lands. Leviticus 25:8-13
 - b. Freedom was being proclaimed to them in a way never before done.
