- 2. "Remember" is a "key" word in these two passages.
- 3. We write things down that we want to remember especially as we grow older
- 4. Peter writes, under the direction of the Holy Spirit, these things to cause them to remember.
- 5. Guy N. Woods said of this passage, "Man is by nature very prone to forget the lessons of the past, the truth once received may become dim and indistinct to those hearts incline toward the world."
