 - d. His whole mission in life was one of submission. John 6:38

 4. To the older ones 1 Peter 5:5
 5. To one another 1 Peter 5:5; Ephesians 5:21
 6. Wives to husbands Col 3:18; Ephesians 5:22; 1 Peter 3:1

 1. Yourself this implies your will and affection
 2. Your time and talent
 3. Your plans and purposes
 4. Your pleasure and possessions
 5. Your cares and anxieties
- D. Why submit? James 4:7; 1 Peter 5:5
 1. Because God resists the proud
 2. Because He gives grace unto the humble. Ps 138:6
