 - a. It divides men from God Isaiah 59:1-2
 - b. It divides families Luke 12:51-53
 - c. It causes conflict with self Galatians 5:17
 - d. It divides from brethren 2 Thessalonians 3:6
 - e. It will divide at Judgment Matthew 25:31-46; Luke 16:19-31
- 2. Sin is deceptive Hebrews 3:13
 - a. Satan is deceptive Genesis 3:1; 2 Corinthians 11:3, 13
 - b. We are not to be deceived 2 Thessalonians 2:3 (deceive or deceived is used 28 times in the New Testament
 - c. Sin promises liberty but brings slavery Romans 6:16-18
 - d. Sin appears attractive, but is hideously ugly Proverbs 14:12
- 3. Sin is destructive Ezekiel 18:30; Luke 15:13-14
 - a. Sin will destroy a good name Proverbs 22:1
 - b. Sin will destroy your body 2 Corinthians 7:1; 1 Corinthians 6:18 (Drinking, smoking, gluttony, worry, adultery)
 - c. Sin will destroy your home Genesis 19: (Lot and his family)
 - d. Sin will destroy the church 1 Corinthians 5
- 4. Sin is dominating Romans 6:14; John 8:34; Galatians 5:1
 - a. Some sins are very dominating
 - i. Drinking Proverbs 20:1
 - ii. Cursing Ephesians 4:29
 - iii. Adultery Matthew 19:3-9
 - iv. Worry Matthew 6:34
 - v. Fault finding Matthew 7:1-5
 - b. Sin can be so dominating that it can make it impossible to obey the Lord Hebrews 3:13; 2 Thessalonians 2:8-12; Romans 1:24,26,28
