4. There is no denominational worship John 4:24; Acts 2:42
 - a. There is no mechanical instruments of music Ephesians 5:19; Colossians 3:16
 - b. There is the partaking of the Lord's Supper every first day of the week Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 11:26 (how often did they do it then?)
5. There are no entangling alliances. 2 Corinthians 6:14-7:1
 - a. The church must remain free from political, economical or secular involvement Philippians 2:12
6. There is no denominational requirement for membership.
 - a. The church does not vote on anyone to come within her fellowship
 - b. The Lord add Acts 2:47
 - c. The Lord subtracts Revelation 2:5, 16; 3:19
 - d. We are only doing what they required in the first century

 - iv. Baptism Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16; Acts 2:38; 8:36; 22:16; Romans 6:3-4
