Introduction

- 1. Luke 10:25-37
- 2. The lawyer tempted Jesus
 - a. Lawyer was one who interpreted the law
 - b. His intentions were to entrap Jesus; catch Him in denying or contradicting the law
- 3. The question of "what shall I do to inherit eternal life" is still a good one today also found in Matthew 19:19
 - a. It was not to know the truth
- 4. Answered
 - a. How do you read What does the Bible say
 - b. All ought to come to the same answer
 - c. Asked this question to see his understanding of the Scriptures
- 5. The lawyer asked the next question to justify himself but Jesus answers it verse 29
- 6. Some point from our lesson today
 - a. Who we are to love
 - b. Who is my neighbor
 - c. How do treat my neighbor which will answer our objective of our lesson topic

III Discussion

- 1. Who are we to love?
 - a. We are to love God
 - i. Found in Deuteronomy 6:3
 - ii. This was one of three sections place within the phylacteries (Matthew 23:5; Deuteronomy 6:8; Exodus 13:16)
 - iii. This love is in the future tense which means it is ongoing, nothing to do with duration.
 - iv. With all our heart the seat of man give up; do or suffer anything to please and glorify Him, hope, heart, desire
 - v. With all our soul the life of man give up comfort
 - vi. With all our strength the physical man might
 - vii. With all our mind the understanding of man
 - viii. This is not just for the preacher
 - ix. John 14:15, 31; 15:10; 3:16; 1 John 4:20; 5:2-3; Ecclesiastes 12:13-14
 - b. We are to love self
 - i. Man is to love wife as self Ephesians 5:28
 - ii. Is it wrong to love self? Luke 9:23; 12:16-21; Matthew 10:37-39
 - iii. We are told how to love our wife Ephesians 5 or husband and even children Titus 2
 - iv. We are told what love is I Corinthians 13 (same word verb and noun)
 - v. This maybe the reason we do not love our neighbor correctly, we do not know how to love ourselves correctly Colossians 3:10-15; Philippians 2:5
 - c. We are to love our neighbor
 - i. Matthew 5:43-44 shows a misunderstanding of the passages of Scriptures
 - ii. Leviticus 19:18 is the passage quoted; not placed within the Phylacteries
 - iii. Neighbor is listed 107 times in the Bible
 - iv. This part is found several times in the New Testament

- v. Love seeks best in body, social, mental, and spiritual needs Taylor Romans
- vi. Prevents all fraud, injustice, oppression, falsehood, adultery, murder, theft and covetousness against one is near.
- 2. Who is my neighbor verse 29
 - a. Could it be that our definition is too restrictive?
 - i. Brother
 - ii. Wife
 - iii. Children
 - iv. One who is in need
 - b. Notice who asked and who answered
 - c. Notice verse 36, who asked and who answered
 - d. The question is answered by noticing the two answers
 - i. The one who had compassion Verse 33
 - ii. The one who showed mercy, did not say the Samaritan
- 3. How do I treat my neighbor?
 - a. He had compassion Verse 33
 - i. The compassion is the same word that is used when Jesus saw the multitudes and individuals that were suffering
 - b. He had mercy Verse 37
 - i. If we want to obtain mercy we must show mercy Matthew 5:7
 - c. In The time of distress, illness, death, loss of job, loss of faith
 - d. I do not lie about my neighbor Exodus 20:16; Deuteronomy 5:20;
 - i. I will talk about good things to and with my neighbor Ephesians 4:15, 29; Colossians 4:6
 - e. I do not lie about me neighbor in things to keep, fellowship, taken by violence; I do not deceive him nor do I lie about things lost to him Leviticus 6:2
 - f. I do not defraud or rob him Leviticus 19:13
 - g. I do not give him to drink Habakkuk 2:15
 - i. I will give him a drink of cold water Matthew 10:42
 - ii. I will give him the proper thing to drink John 4:9-14
 - h. I do please my brothers Romans 15:2; Yet Galatians 1:10 limits that
 - i. I will not work ill toward my brother Romans 13:9-10
 - i. I will work good toward him
 - j. I will not bite and devour my neighbor Galatians 5:13-15
 - k. I will not despise him James 2:5-8
 - i. I will treat him with honor and respect
