- 1. Acts 11:26; 26; 28; 1 Peter 4:16
- 2. The term "Christian" only appears three times in the New Testament
- 3. This name is a God given name Isaiah 62:2; 65:15
- 4. God is glorified in this name when the wearer is in reality what the name implies.
- 5. In each of the scriptures there is a basic characteristic of a Christian set forth, let us study each.

II Discussion

- 1. Acts 11:26 A Christians is a disciple of Christ
 - a. A disciple is a learner
 - i. Christianity is a taught religion John 6:44-45; Matthew 28:18-20
 - ii. One does not become a Christian through:
 - 1. Dreams John 8:31-32
 - 2. Direct working of the Holy Spirit independent of God's Word 1 Peter 1:22-23
 - iii. The process of becoming and being a Christian is a learning process 2 Peter 3:18
 - b. A disciple is a follower of Christ
 - i. Jesus left an example for us to follow 1 Peter 2:21
 - ii. The Standard for Christian conduct is not:
 - 1. Worldly philosophy Colossians 2:8
 - 2. The Law of Moses Colossians 2:14-17
 - 3. Mysticism Colossians 2:18
 - 4. The Crowd Matthew 7:13-14
 - c. If one spends time learning something else then he is a disciple of that philosophy and not Christ.
- 2. Acts 26:28 A Christian is one who is persuaded
 - a. He is convinced that Christianity is true Philippians 3:4-11
 - b. He is willing to persuade others that Christianity is true Acts 19:8; 2 Corinthians 5:10-11
 - c. He is convinced that he can live the Christians life Philippians 4:13
 - d. He is persuaded that Christianity is worth the cost Matthew 16:24-26; Luke 14:26-29
 - e. Are we persuaded that Christianity is all-sufficient?
- 3. 1 Peter 4:16 A Christian is one who is willing to suffer for doing right
 - a. Some suffer as the results of foolish living or poor choices 1 Peter 4:15
 - b. Some suffer for living the Christian life 1 Peter 4:12-16; 3:14; 2 Timothy 3:12
 - c. The early Christians suffered Acts 8:1-4
- 4. A Christians is one who is not ashamed 1 Peter 4:16
 - a. He is not ashamed of the Gospel Romans 1:16
 - b. He is not ashamed of Christ Mark 8:38
 - c. There is nothing to be ashamed of!

- 2. Are you persuaded that Christianity alone is sufficient?
- 3. Are you suffering?
- 4. Are you ashamed of Christ?

- 5. One must answer these questions correctly in order to have the inheritance promised 1 Peter 1:4
