Introduction

- 1. Hebrews 2:1 NKJV
- 2. The tenor of the book of Hebrews is to keep Jewish Christians from drifting back into Judaism and from the truth. We too can drift from the truth. Verse 3 "we"
- 3. Thus this warning is for us today
- 4. In today lesson we want to discuss the meaning of drift, the symptoms of drifting, what causes drifting, and the consequences of drifting.

II Discussion

- 1. The meaning of "drifting"
 - a. Literally it means to flow past, or to glide by, as in a boat with no anchor.
 - b. To drift means to neglect Hebrews 2:3, neglect a garden and the weeds will take over, so it is in our spiritual life; the weeds of worldliness will take over.
 - c. To drift means to forsake the Lord Isaiah 1:4; Jeremiah 2:13; John 6:66
 - d. To drift means to depart from God 1 Samuel 15:15-18
- 2. The symptoms of drifting
 - a. You can treat the symptoms and never affect the disease!
 - b. Lose the Joy of salvation Philippians 4:4; Psalm 51:12
 - c. Cease to pray 1 Thessalonians 5:17; Luke 22:42
 - d. Discontent, critical Matthew 7:1-3
 - e. Foolish excuses Luke 14:16-24
 - f. Neglect Bible study 1 Peter 2:2; Psalm 119:105, 130
 - g. Neglect the worship John 4:24; Hebrews 10:25
 - h. Less work in the church 1 Corinthians 15:58
 - i. Neglect of souls Proverbs 11:30; 1 Timothy 4:16
- 3. The causes of drifting
 - a. The deceitfulness of sin Hebrew 3:12; 11:24-25
 - b. There is plenty of time to become concerned about salvation James 4:13-14; Proverbs 27:1; 2 Corinthians 6:2
 - c. Some look for a convenient season acts 24:25
 - d. Some are burdened with "cares" of this life Luke 8:14
 - e. Some think that God will make an exception to them Romans 2:11; Acts 10:34-35
- 4. The consequences of drifting
 - a. Deceit is involved; most don't start out to leave God, but little by little, Lake a boat not anchored, it will be away from where we want it.
 - b. Downward not upward dead fish go down stream, live fish go up stream
 - c. Damnation of the soul if not resolved 2 Corinthians 5:10
 - d. God has given us all we need to keep from drifting, will we use what we have?

III Conclusion

- 1. Each person is responsible for himself 2 Corinthians 13:5
- 2. Are you drifting, are you off course?
- 3. Some may not have entered the boat and thus are not drifting they are not close to the Lord
- 4. If you are drifting then come back
