- 2. Moses is giving blessings on all the tribes of Israel, in this section Joseph is given his blessings.
- 3. Moses is not asking for just anything for the tribe of Joseph but the precious things.
- 4. What do we consider precious? Children, grandchildren, wife, mother, family heirloom?
- 5. What in the spiritual realm do we consider precious?
- 6. Peter gives us some things that ought to be precious to us, let us consider them:

II Introduction

- 1. Trials 1 Peter 1:7
 - a. This would compare our faith with pure gold
 - b. The price of gold is so much an ounce This was in 2009 \$847 then a pound is worth \$13, 552. 1/12/22 The price of gold is \$1,826.33 an ounce or \$29,221.28 a pound!
 - c. Your faith is tried by fire, the temptations are many and the test determines the character.
 - d. Faith is being tested so that in the end it will be worth the approval of Christ.
 - e. How much is your faith worth?
 - f. Is your faith being tested?
- 2. Blood of Christ 1 Peter 1:18-19
 - a. We were not and are not bought with gold or silver that perishes.
 - b. We are bought with the Lamb of God John 1:29, 36 who is without blemish and spot, so that we can be without blemish and spot Ephesians 5:27
 - c. How do we treat the blood of Christ? Hebrews 10:26-31.
- 3. The living stone which is Christ 1 Peter 2:3-6
 - a. The context transfers from milk to a building
 - b. Christ is the chief corner stone and is living
 - c. He is the one with whom we are to compare ourselves
 - d. Yet He was rejected by men, He did not fit their mold of who the Messiah ought to be.
 - e. God selected Him because He was precious (Matthew 3:17)
 - f. What think ye of Christ?
- 4. Meek and quiet spirit 1 Peter 3:4
 - a. The context is that of God describing a godly wife
 - b. "Meek" is a person who is "Christlike" Matthew 11:28-30; 21:5
 - c. Quiet spirit is tranquility rising from within
- 5. Faith 2 Peter 1:1
 - a. This faith according to the Greek is synonymous with the Gospel Galatians 1:23; Jude 3
 - b. The faith had be made available to the Gentiles and was of equal honor with the Jews
 - c. All have access to the Gospel Acts 10:34-35
- 6. Divine promises 2 Peter 1:4
 - a. What do we think of the promises of God?
 - b. Peter calls the promises of God exceeding great and then they are also precious.
 - c. These promises include forgiveness (Ephesians 1:7), peace (Philippians 4:7), eternal life (1 John 2:25; 5:11) and help (Hebrews 13:5-6)

III Conclusion

- 1. These things are precious to God are they precious to us?
- 2. If they are precious let us respond if a favorable way to them.
- 3. Obedience is what God demands.
