## Introduction

- 1. Psalm 51: 12
- 2. Many deep emotions are manifested in the Psalms. Notice 14:1-4 and our text
- 3. Unhappiness is seen in the world and was experienced by David, yet our Psalm tells us of the joy of salvation
- 4. This joy can be perceived in many people within the New Testament
  - a. Acts 2:46 "...did eat their meat with gladness and singleness of heart."
  - b. Acts 8:8 "And there was great joy in that city."
  - c. Acts 8:39 "...and he went on his way rejoicing."
  - d. Acts 16:34 "...he set meat before them, and rejoiced..."
  - e. Philippians is a book of joy (20 times)
- 5. The Psalmist opens unto us the potential of the joy of salvation.

## II Discussion

- 1. The joy of Salvation can be had only in forgiveness
  - a. The joy of forgiveness comes from a realization of the seriousness of sin
    - i. David realized this Verse 1,3 transgression, verse 2, 3 iniquity and sin and verse 9 hide thy face from my sins
    - ii. David had gotten his life out of focus; it was distorted; he had missed the mark set by God
  - b. The sin was against God verse 4
  - c. The sacrifices God wants from man is a broken and a contrite heart verse 17
  - d. The desire is for forgiveness is seen within the Psalm
    - i. Blot out the sin verse 1, 9 Sin on the debt side of God's ledger, blot it out!
    - ii. Wash me this is the method of washing in which stains are removed verses 2, 7
    - iii. Cleanse me verse 2 where sin is no longer upon a person
- 2. The joy of Salvation can only be had in a cleansed heart verse 10
  - a. Happiness or joy is a condition of the heart Proverbs 4:23; 23:7
  - b. Guilt does not burden a cleansed heart Hebrews 8:12
  - c. Fear does not control a cleansed heart 1 John 4:18; Hebrews 13:5-6
  - d. Doubt does not disturb a cleansed heart
  - e. Steadfastness is the results of a cleansed heart 1 Corinthians 15:58 which will serve God come what may
  - f. A cleaned heart is one that will willing serve God
- 3. The joy of Salvation can only be had in Recognition of God's Presence
  - a. God had a personal interest in David, a special love for him; the same is true for each one of us. John 3:16; Romans 5:6-9; 1 Timothy 2:4
  - b. God is loving kindness verse 1; Ephesians 2:7
  - c. God is merciful verse 1; 2 Corinthians 1:3
  - d. God is righteous verse 14
  - e. God cannot be in the presence of sin Exodus 33:7
  - f. What is your relationship with God?

## **III Conclusion**

- 1. All men have sinned Roman 3:23; Psalm 53:3
- 2. All men come to God with clean hands 1 John 1:8-10
- 3. If a man has a good heart then you can begin to accomplish great things 1 Samuel 16:7
- 4. David did not deny his sin, he faced it before God

- 5. David confessed his sin and sought God's forgiveness and cleansing
- 6. Will you have a heart like David's
- 7. Will you come to God to have a clean heart and hands
- 8. Will you come to the Blood of Christ to have a cleansed heart
- 9. Then you too can be restored to the joy of your salvation
- 10. If need to come, come now
