    - d. She is told to "fear not go and do but make me a cake first" 1 Kings 17:13
  - 3. Leper Naaman
    - a. Many lepers during this time Luke 4:27
    - b. Yet a Gentile leper was cleansed. 2 Kings 5:11
    - c. Because he dipped in the River Jordan seven times as commanded
  - 4. David
    - a. A household name. Children have been thrilled about David
    - b. David heard the same things that the others heard 1 Samuel 17:22-26, 28
    - c. David knew where it deliverance would come from 1 Samuel 17:37
  - 5. Saul-Paul
    - a. Acts 8:1,3; 9:1
    - b. 1 Timothy 1:15
    - c. 1 Corinthians 15:10
    - d. He obeyed from the Heart Romans 6:16-18
