- 1. The origin of life
 - a. It is from God Genesis 1:26-27; 2:7
 - b. The difference between man and animal is man has a soul.
 - c. Man sins Romans 3:23 and is in need of salvation James 1:21; 5:20
 - d. God has provided a way for man to be saved
 - i. The Love of God John 3:16
 - ii. The mercy of God Titus 3:5
 - iii. The Grace of God Ephesians 2:8
 - e. The body dies when the soul leaves James 1:26
- 2. The purpose of your life
 - a. The purpose of life is not found in the promises of men
 - i. We cannot find happiness with the idea what can the church do for me, but what can I do for the church to find happiness
 - ii. We were made into the image of God, not God into our image
 - b. Our purpose is not eat, drink and be merry for tomorrow we die 1 Corinthians 15:32
 - c. Our purpose is to be found in the purpose God has for each of us Matthew 22:37
 - d. Our purpose is to fear God and keep His commandments Ecclesiastes 12:13-14
 - e. All other purposes are under this purpose 1 Timothy 5:8
- 3. The duration of your life
 - a. Life is like a vapor James 4:14
 - b. Life is like a flower James 1:10-11; 1 Peter 1:24
 - c. Life is lie a shadow Job 14:1-2
 - d. This issue is important because man live but one time on earth Hebrews 9:27
 - e. Life's destiny is dependent upon our purpose 2 Corinthians 5:10
 - f. Life's clock

The clock of life is wound by once, And no man has the power To tell just when the hands will stop, At late or early hour.

To lose one's wealth is sad, indeed, To lose one's health is more; To lose one's soul is such a loss, And no man can restore.

 - i. Life Matthew 7:13-14
 - ii. Eternal life Romans 6:23
 - iii. Immortality Romans 2:7
 - c. The direction of Your life determines the destiny Matthew 7:13-14
 - d. The destiny of your life is eternal Matthew 25:46
