II Discussion

- 1. He was informed of his duties 1 Kings 20:39
 - a. The orders were simple
 - i. Do you think the orders to keep the prisoner were misunderstood, no
 - ii. Do we have orders that are given to us that we might misunderstand, no
 - b. The orders were substantial
 - i. There was enough information given so that the orders could be carried out
 - ii. We have enough information given to us about any aspect of worship or work so that we too can carry out the job John 4:24; 1 Corinthians 15:58; James 4:17
 - c. The orders were settled
 - i. There were consequences for not doing the job, this was stated
 - ii. There are consequences for us not doing the job God has given us John 5:28-29
- 2. He had the inclination to carry out the orders. 1 Kings 20:39
 - a. He had the ability to carry out the orders Matthew 25:15
 - i. The man thought that the other man had the abilities to carry out the commands given
 - ii. We have the abilities to carry out every command of God
 - b. He had the assets to carry out the orders
 - i. What every was needed to carry out the orders the man had the necessary physical and mental assets to carry out the job
 - ii. We too have all the necessary assets to carry out every job God has given us. Going or worshiping we have all we need to carry out God's commands John 4:24; 2 Timothy 2:2
 - c. He had the ample time to carry out the orders
 - i. Now is the time to work John 9:4; 4:35-38
- 3. He was not idle but busy doing everything but his duties 1 Kings 20:40 Luke 8:14
 - a. Cares of this life sometimes get us distracted 1 Timothy 5:8, 11-16
 - b. Coins sometimes get us distracted Matthew 16:26; 19:21, 29
 - c. Contentment sometimes get us distracted Philippians 3:8; Matthew 6:33

III Conclusion

- 1. The man was not idle in sinful pursuits but became to involved with the other things
- 2. We too can become involved in other things and lose sight of what we are really about
- 3. Opportunities may never come again 2 Corinthians 6:2
