 - b. Here dealing with the latter see also Hebrews 6:4-6; James 5:19-20; 2 Peter 2:20-22
 - c. We ought to try to restore these folks Luke 15:
 - d. Still the blood of Christ saves 1 John 1:7
5. The responding to the needs of others Galatians 6:6, 9-10
 - a. Is this saint's only? Why then did the Holy Spirit have Paul write, "unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith?"
 - b. Are only the brethren the one's in need Ephesians 4:28?
 - c. Are the "fatherless" members? James 1:27 Can the church practice "pure religion?"
