 - A. **Positive aspects** (15:2, 4): Those who worship the Lord:
 - 1. He walketh uprightly; 1 John 1:7; Ephesians 2:2; 4:1, 17; 5:2, 8, 15
 - 2. He worketh righteousness (15:2); Psalm 119:172; John 4:24
 - 3. speak the truth (15:2); John 17:17; 1 Peter 4:11
 - 4. Vile person in contemned, spurned (15:4); Ephesians 5:11; 1 Corinthians 15:33
 - 5. honor the fearful (15:4) Proverbs 1:7; 2 Timothy 2:15; John 5:39; Ephesians 6:1-4
 - 6. keep their promises even when it hurts (15:4). Ecclesiastes 5:4
 - B. **Negative aspects** (15:3, 5): Those who worship the Lord refuse to:
 - 1. He backbite others (15:3); does not slander Galatians 5:15
 - 2. harm their neighbors (15:3); Matthew 7:12
 - 3. speak evil of their friends (15:3); Matthew 5:11
 - 4. charge interest on loans (15:5);
 - 5. accept bribes to testify against the innocent (15:5). Bear false witness Exodus 20:16; Proverbs 6: 16-19
