 - b. They did keep it the second year Numbers 9:2-5
 - c. There was given another time, Numbers 9:9-14
 - d. The next time they kept the Passover was Joshua 5:10-11
 - e. The next recorded time is when Josiah was king 2 Chronicles 35:1-7
 - f. Then Ezra 6:20 when they came out of captivity
 - g. There could have been other times they kept the Passover but it is not recorded
 - 3. The Lord's Supper for us Luke 22:19; 1 Corinthians 11:24-25
 - a. The Lord's Supper is to remember the Lord's death till He come 1 Corinthians 11:26
 - b. It is not to be corrupted 1 Corinthians 10:21, 16
 - c. It is a time of remembrance Luke 22:19
 - d. The connection between Passover and the Lord's Supper Matthew 26:17ff
 - i. John 1:29; Exodus 12:3
 - ii. The Lord's Supper was instituted during the Passover
 - iii. The Jews did not enter into the judgement hall lest they defile themselves John 19:28
 - iv. Yet they were willing to kill the Son of God
 - v. The unleavened bread, leaven represents sin
 - e. There is the absence of corruption, the sinless life of Christ
 - i. We are to examine ourselves 1 Corinthians 11:28
 - f. The time to keep the Lord's Supper is the first day of the week Acts 20:7
 - 4. Names for the Lord's Supper
 - a. Communion 1 Corinthians 10:16 (fellowship)
 - b. The Lord's Supper 1 Corinthians 11:20 (some may call what they to the Lord's Supper but it is not)
 - c. Lord's Table 1 Corinthians 10:21
 - d. Breaking of bread Acts 20:7 (context tells us it is not a common mean)
 - e. It is never called sacrament or eucharist these terms are not found in the Bible
