- 1. Ephesians 1:18
- 2. The Bible has much to say about the eye. The word "eyes is used 501 times in the Bible
- 3. The eyes can communicate much:
 - a. Do you remember the "look" from your mother's eyes
 - b. Love
 - c. Concern
 - d. Indifference
 - e. Hate
- 4. The eye reveals much about the health of the body
 - a. A doctor by looking in your eye with special instruments can detect diabetes, cataracts and health problems.
- 5. Jesus mentioned the eye. Matthew 6:22-23 context is 19-23;
 - a. One may suffer from a Cataract of covetousness
 - b. One may not see clearly spiritually because of an myopia of selfishness
 - c. Matthew 13:14-15; Acts 28:26-27 (Isaiah 6:9-10).
- 6. Let us look to the book of Ephesians to see what Paul wanted us to perceive.

- 1. Ephesians 1:18, "The eyes of your understanding being enlightened."
 - a. Word meaning as used here in this passage.
 - i. The word "eyes" is used here to mean the base of understanding.
 - ii. The word "know" means to see by implication.
 - iii. Someone may explain something and the other person might say, "I see" meaning I understand.
 - b. Three things we need to know or see
 - i. What is the hope of God's calling.
 - 1. God's people have been called. 2 Thessalonians 2:14; Matthew 11:28-30; Revelation 22:17.
 - 2. Without this calling we are without hope Ephesians 2:12
 - 3. There is one hope of this calling. Ephesians 4:4
 - 4. Saved by this hope 1 Peter 1:3; Romans 8:24
 - ii. What is the riches of this inheritance.
 - 1. Seen in the price paid Ephesians 1:7; 5:25-26
 - 2. Seen in the value of the soul. Matthew 16:26; John 3:16
 - 3. Seen in our relationship with God. 1 John 3:1-2
 - 4. Seen in the gift promised. John 14:1-3
 - iii. What is the greatness of His power
 - 1. The power seen in the resurrection. Romans 1:4
 - 2. The power working in us. Philippians 4:13; Ephesians 2:10; 3:20-21
 - 3. The power in the word. Ephesians 3:1-7; Romans 1:16
 - 4. The power to stand against Satan Ephesians 6:10-7
