Are You Listening?

Introduction

- 1. Text Acts 28:23-31
- 2. The Great Commission imposes upon God's people the responsibility to teach and preach God's Truth Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16; Luke 24:46-47
- 3. The hearer has responsibility also. Mark 16:15-16; Luke 8:18
- 4. Whether or not the hearer believes depends on the attitude he has toward God's truth.
 - a. One must believe that the truth is from God. John 1:17; 17:17; 7:17
 - b. One must love the truth. 2 Thessalonians 2:10-12
- 5. Let us look at the message and their reaction to this message.

II Discussion

- A. Paul preached the kingdom of God. Acts 28:23, 31
 - 1. Acts begins by emphasizing the importance of the kingdom Acts 1:3
 - 2. The kingdom came with power on the day of Pentecost. Mark 9:1 Acts 1:8; 2:1
 - 3. The kingdom is made up of those who have accepted the truth of Jesus as King.
 - a. They have been baptized. Acts 2:38
 - b. The were faithful to the Lord Acts 2:42
 - 4. Paul preached the same thing Philip did Acts 8:12
- B. Paul sought to persuade the Jews concerning Jesus. Acts 28:23
 - 1. Paul preached that the death of Christ was necessary for man's salvation. Acts 17:3; Romans 5:6-9
 - 2. Paul preached the resurrection of Christ as a historical fact! Acts 17:3, Romans 1:4; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4
 - 3. Paul preached that Jesus was the Christ the anointed of God. Acts 17:3
 - 4. Paul preached the impending judgment with Christ as the Judge, Acts 17:30-31; 2 Corinthians 5:10-11
- C. The reaction of the hearers.
 - 1. Remember this is recorded by the Holy Spirit so this is His appraisal of their actions.
 - 2. The context of Isaiah will help understand this passage. Isaiah 44
 - a. The people were determined to have their idols. Vs 9-20
 - b. They had close their eyes to the truth of God. Vs 18
 - c. Their own heart had produced this deception Vs 20
 - 3. Even in Christ's day men refused to listen to His teaching. Matthew 13:14-16
 - a. The hearers closed their eyes and ears Matthew 13:15
 - b. Therefore they did not understand the saving truth of the Lord. Vs 15
 - c. Consequently, they were not saved, or healed vs 15
 - d. The good soil is the person with a good and honest heart. Vs 23; Luke 8:15
 - 4. Paul's hearers also fulfilled this prophecy. Acts 28:25-27

- a. The problem was not with the truth!
- b. The problem was the attitude of the hearers.
- 5. Some who heard did believe Acts 28:24
 - a. When the soil is good, the Word produces fruit. Matthew 13:23; Luke 8:15
 - b. The power is in the Word. Romans 1:16
 - c. The hearers must be receptive to the Gospel 1 Thessalonians 2:13

III Conclusion

- 1. If one is willing to do God's will he will know what God's will is. John 7:17 He will take the time to find out!
- 2. If one is determined not to do what God requires but rather what the individual himself wants to do, God will let this person believe a lie. 2 Thessalonians 2:10-12
- 3. If any man hath an heart let him hear. Revelation 2:7,11,17,29; 3:6,13,22
- 4. Are you listening?
