Introduction

- 1. Text Revelation 3:1-5
- 2. Sardis was the capital of Lydia, a little more than 30 miles south-southeast of Thyatira.
- 3. Sardis was built on a citadel inaccessible from three sides and easily protected on the fourth.
- 4. It rose 1,500 ft about the plain below.
- 5. Kings that lived there were noted for their wealth, splendor and luxury.
- 6. In 549 BC Cyrus' soldiers found a crevice in the rocks and took the city by surprise. This happened again in 218 BC by the men of Antiochus the Great
- 7. The city worshipped the goddess Cybele.
- 8. An earthquake destroyed the city in AD 17. Tiberius rebuilt the city. When John writes to this city it is a city with a past but no future. The church and the city are in a similar predicament.
 - a. Each had a name that they lived but were dead
 - b. Each fulfilled none of its works; both promised but failed to execute.
 - c. With each it was to watch, or be surprised as by a thief.
 - d. Both were defiled by immorality.
- 9 There are three promises to this church that I want us to notice this morning.

- A. He that overcometh shall thus be arrayed in white garments.
 - 1. The proper garments must be had. Matthew 22:11-14
 - 2. We can have the proper garment by putting it on. Galatians 3:27
 - 3. This garment is righteous living. Revelation 19:8
 - 4. We must be prepared. John 14:1-3
 - 5. White shows that this garment is pure. Isaiah 1:18
- B. I will in no wise blot his name out of the book of life.
 - 1. This book has been known of for a long time. Exodus 32:32; Daniel 12:1
 - 2. Jesus told of this book. Luke 10:20
 - 3. Paul knew of this book. Philippians 4:3
 - 4. John knew of this book Revelation 3:5; 17:8; 20:12, 15; 21:27; 22:19
 - 5. We will be judged out of what is written. John 12:48, Revelation 20:12; 15; II Corinthians 5:10
- C. I will confess his name before my Father and His angels.
 - 1. Jesus had already declared this. Matthew 10:32-33
 - 2. One must remain faithful until death. Revelation 2:10
 - 3. It is a way of life. Romans 1:16; 10:10
 - 4. God has confessed His Son. Matthew 3:17; 17:5
 - 5. All men will confess. Philippians 2:11; Romans 14:11-12

1. These three promises if one will overcome, then he will not be blotted out of the book, will be confessed before God and His angels by Christ.
