 - C. Prejudice might keep us from seeing the true value of a thing. James 2:1-4
4. Come and see where the Lord is. Matthew 28:6
 - A. He is not there. He is risen.
 - B. This proves Him to be the Son of God. Romans 1:4
 - C. Where is the Lord? On God's right hand. Acts 7:55; Hebrews 1:3; Acts 2:33; Colossians 3:1; 1 Peter 3:22
