  - a. The idea from the Greek is to give diligence
  - b. So 2 Timothy 2:15 "study" is involved
  - c. We are to give diligence to add 2 Peter 1:3-112
  - d. The passage says we are to give diligence to enter into the rest Matthew 11:28-30.
  - e. Context says this is heaven

  - a. Also used in 3:6; 10:23
  - b. It means more that continuing to believe; it also included public demonstration. Matthew 10:32-33; Revelation 2:10; 2 Timothy 3:12
  - c. The church is Sardis was told to hold fast Revelation 3:3
  - d. We are to hold fast to that which is good 1 Thessalonians 5:21
- 4. Let us come near 4:16
  - a. This is coming into the throne room of God and asking petitions of Him.
  - b. The opportunity to pray, err you left your room this morning did you think to pray?
  - c. Pray without ceasing 1 Thessalonians 5:17
  - d. Our asking must be correct James 4:3
