Introduction

- 1. Text Philippians 2:12
- 2. This verse is the secret of all the joy in this epistle
- 3. This verse in a continuance of obedience 1:27; 2:8 The "Wherefore" or "So then" NKJV
- 4. In the church at Philippi, Paul's words as spoken in Christ's name had aroused them to a diligent effort to put time into practice
- 5. In this passage we find commandments, conviction and commitment.
- 6. Let us study these.

II Discussion

- 1. Commandments are to be obeyed
 - a. They has obeyed, "as ye have always obeyed"
 - b. Work out means to work to completion. We must work out our salvation until it is completed
 - c. This is not earned salvation but works that must be completed John 6:28-29; Ephesians 2:8-10; Titus 3:5
 - d. The "wherefore" is a conclusion drawn on the preceding paragraph notice vs 8 Christ became obedient to the cross we become obedient vs 12
 - e. We must then obey Hebrews 5:8-9; Romans 2:8; Galatians 3:1; 5:7; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9 obey not; 1 Peter 4:17
- 2. There are convictions that come about because of these commands
 - a. There is an attitude in obeying these commands Isaiah 66:2
 - b. Fear is used by Paul and has to do with obedience 1 Corinthians 2:3; 2 Corinthians 7:15; Ephesians 6:5
 - c. This fear is not just the fear of God but the greatness of the task and the possibility of failure 1 Corinthians 10:12; Hebrews 2:1-3
 - d. I must obey God at all cost. Luke 14:28-33
- 3. There are commitments then because of the convictions
 - a. These commands are personal 2 Corinthians 5:10-11
 - b. We must live righteously Titus 2:11-12
 - c. I have a commitment to them Romans 14:23
 - d. No one can make laws where God did not make laws. Galatians 5:1; 1 Corinthians 6:12; 10:23
 - e. No can lose where God did not lose.

III Conclusion

- 1. We must work out our salvation no one can do that for us.

- 3. Are you working or playing?
- 4. Now is the time to work! Obey
