 - d. If one joins the military he is not expected to stay at the same rank the whole time he is in the military. 2 Timothy 2:3-4
 - e. The church needs elders, deacons, preachers, and Bible class teachers, personal teachers.
 - f. Moses tried to give an excuse. Exodus 4:10; Acts 7:22

 - b. He is to be head of the house, Ephesians 5:23, 31
