- 1. Psalm 133:1-3; John 17:20-21
- 2. The problem of unity has been around for a long time 1 Corinthians 1:10
- 3. This lesson deals only with unity but very closely connected are authority (on what are we going to unity) fellowship (with whom will we stay united)
- 4. Today we want to discuss the who, what when and where of unity

II Discussion

- 1. Who are to unite?
 - a. Brethren are to unite Psalm 133:1
 - i. Galatians 6:1 written to the churches of Galatia 1:2; 1 Corinthians 15:1,58
 - ii. Based on the family relationship Romans 8:14,17; 1 Timothy 3:15
 - b. Those that agree or walk together Amos 3:3
 - c. The religious world that believes in Christ John 17:20-21
- 2. What is meant by unity
 - a. We mean more than union or unity in diversity. Cats tied together and then thrown over a clothes line have union but not unity
 - b. Webster unity; the quality or state of not being multiple; ONEESS.
 - c. Ephesians 4:4-6 extend this idea
 - i. One body = unity in organization
 - ii. One Spirit = unity of revelation
 - iii. One hope = unity of aspiration
 - iv. One Lord = unity of authority
 - v. One faith = unity of belief
 - vi. One baptism = unity of practice
 - vii. One God = unity of worship
- 3. When us unity to be had?
 - a. When we accept the authority of the scriptures Matthew 28:18; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 3:16
 - b. When we all learn to speak the same thing and be of the same mind and judgment 1 Corinthians 1:10
 - c. When we learn to speak where the Bible speaks and are silent where the Bible is silent. 1 Peter 4:11
- 4. Where do we unite?
 - a. Not on conscience for it could be wrong. Acts 28:1; 1 Timothy 4:1-2
 - b. Not on man-made doctrine Galatians 1:6-12 Matthew 15:8-9
 - c. We must unite then only on the word of God. John 12:48; 1 Peter 4:11 Titus 2:1
 - d. Some who have changed God's word:
 - i. Nadab and Abihu Leviticus 10:1-2
 - ii. King Saul tried to change God's worship 1 Samuel 13:9
 - iii. Jeroboam changed the worship of God. 1 Kings 13:32-33
- 5. How do we unite?

- a. By putting away man-made doctrines such as:
 - i. Sprinkling
 - ii. Instrumental music in worship
 - iii. Lord's Supper at any time or with anything
 - iv. Direct Operation of the Holy Spirit before or after conversion
 - v. Losing where God did not lose
 - vi. Binding where God did not bind
 - vii. Social drinking
 - viii. Clapping and raising hands, swaying during worship
- b. We can only unite on what God has given us, the Bible. 1 Corinthians 1:10; 1 Peter 4:11

III Conclusion

- 1. We can only unite when we accept the word of God as our only source of authority and walk in it precepts
- 2. The problem has been around for a long time but it can be overcome.
- 3. Will you unite with us by believing, repenting confessing and by being baptized?
