  - c. What would the dead say if they could speak to us? Luke 16:28; Hebrews 11:4 but are we listening?
- 4. Communication with the dead is impossible, in the Bible we have some messages from the dead to the living. These messages are most important! What are these messages?

## II Discussion

- 1. The voice of Samuel 1 Samuel 28:15-19
  - a. The occasion of Saul's visit to the necromancer of Endor. Deuteronomy 18:10-11 Thompson chain 2228 1 Samuel 28:11
    - i. The Philistines were gathered for war against Israel and Saul feared Vs 4-5
    - ii. God would not talk to Saul, so he resorted to a woman who had a familiar spirit. Vs 6-14
  - b. The message of Samuel to Saul is a message to the living today
    - i. The certainty of death. Vs 19; 1 Kings 2:2; Hebrews 9:27
    - ii. The proximity of death, tomorrow Vs 19 1 Peter 1:24; James 4:13-14; Job 14:1
    - iii. Many may refuse to talk about death but it is coming to all of us
    - iv. No one knows when we will die, nor how close to death we are at this moment, cancer, heart attack etc.
- 2. The Voice of the Rich man. Luke 16:23-28
  - a. The message of the rich man is a message concern life after death
    - i. Job 14:14 If a man dies, shall he live again?
    - ii. Immortality is seen, vs 23
    - iii. Death does not end it all Hebrews 12:1
  - b. The horribleness of the punishment of the wicked
    - i. Being in torment Vs 23
    - ii. There is the most severe suffering awaiting the disobedient in eternity. Its nature is fire, it is the opposite of comfort and its duration forever. Luke 16:24; Matthew 8:12; Mark 9:48; 2 Thessalonians 1:9
  - c. The warning to all, Lest they also come into this place of torment. Luke 16:28
    - i. The Bible is full of warnings Matthew 7:13-14; Ezekiel 18:20-32; Amos 4:12
    - ii. To those headed for the same place, listen to this rich man, "Don't come here whatever you do."

- 3. The voice of Able Hebrews 11:4
  - a. The message is preparations for death
    - i. The necessity of faith Hebrews 11:4 by faith
    - ii. Faith is necessary Hebrews 11:1; John 8:24 Acts 16:31; 2 Corinthians 5:7
    - iii. Able says the life of faith is the only life to live
  - b. The meaning of faith
    - i. Acceptable faith is obedient faith Vs 7 vs 8 vs 17
    - ii. Able says put your faith into action and obey God. James 2:24
  - c. The reward of faith
    - i. Able was righteous
    - ii. Obedient faith is imputed for righteousness James 2:23
    - iii. An obedient faith unites with Christ Galatians 3:26-27
    - iv. This kind of life (faithful) will lead to heaven Revelation 2:10
    - v. Able says, faith has its rewards trust and obey God and see

- 1. Everyone should be willing to listen to and respect these voices from the dead, they speak the truth with all honesty and sincerity
