 - g. It is obsession with the temporal, material thing to the exclusion of spiritual growth and the neglect of spiritual interest.
 - h. Worldliness is a force that sidetracks the Christian from his greatest privilege and function—personal Christian growth fruitful service.
 - i. Worldliness in majoring on the temporal rather than spiritual.
 - j. It is habits, attitude, and inconsistencies, influences that hinder our fellowship with God.
 - k. It is a cancer that creates indifferences.
 - 1. It is anything that leads away from God rather than closer to Him
